# Environmental Product Declaration (EPD)

An Environmental Product Declaration (EPD) is a Type III environmental declaration that quantifies environmental information about the life cycle of a product. This can enable comparisons between products fulfilling the same function. The methodology to produce an EPD is based on the full product life cycle assessment (LCA), following the ISO 14040 series of standards.

## GLOBAL WARMING POTENTIAL

To quantify and compare results, we use the Global Warming Potential (GWP) expressed in kg CO<sub>2</sub>-equivalent. This is a measurement method for finding out the amount of energy required to emit 1 tonne of a gas, which is absorbed over a 100-year period. The greater the GWP, the more a particular gas warms the earth.

To comply with EN ISO 15804+A2, Casala uses the 'cradle to grave' assessment for their EPD files. The assessment covers the full life cycle of a product; from production phase to use, followed by recycling or disposal. Other EPD files often only use the 'cradle to gate' assessment, which only covers the production phase.
